Round Hill defibrillator

- Consulted with BHF, paramedics (including local paramedic, Barry Smith) and RHS
- Article in Winter issue of RHS
- GoFundMe campaign launched in October with target of £2,000 to cover purchase of defibrillator and external cabinet and installation
 - o **Target achieved in two days!** Thanks to generosity of Round Hill community, with particularly large donations from Gilly Smith in memory of her late husband, and Stuart Chapman
- Still in negotiations with landlords over where it will be located - speaking to Roundhill pub and Highways department of the Council next year
- Meeting with Ailsa McWhinnie if the Sylvan Hall residents' association to discuss defib locations


Ditchling Road -- Prince's Crescent Bus Stop 'Pocket Park' Proposal

January 2021

Current status

- End of 2018 started discussing the idea of Round Hill Green Spaces (RHGS)
- October 2019 submitted petition to the council for a RHGS at three sites: (1) planters to narrow the Crescent Road-Prince's Crescent junction; (2) planters at the junction of Richmond and Mayo Roads; and (3) a pocket park at the southbound Ditchling Road-Prince's Crescent bus stop
- January 2021 formal proposal sent to council officers
- Petition about improving road safety presented to ETS in November 2021
- January & February 2022 council officers and ward councillors make site visit
- Space gets "permission in principle" and highways licence for a bus stop pocket park but dependent on checking if planning consent is required

RHGS 2022

- April 2022 received ward councillor funding of £1,000 from Pete West and Sue Shanks
- May 2022 RHGS Plant Sale £230 raised
- June 2022 received Jubilee planting funding £200
- September 2022 refreshed planters with soil and new plants from One Garden
- November 2022 submitted planning application for bus stop pocket park
- December 2022 will re-submit planning application with required technical changes
